Unfortunately, the current Council majority chose not to renew the Madison 2020 Committee, and consequently, we are not taking advantage of our accreditation with Sustainable Jersey. If I am returned to Council, I will wholeheartedly support the reinstitution of the Madison 2020 Committee and will work with them to obtain grants for the town of Madison that will help us protect the environment, save us money, and improve our quality of life.
